Course Description

A study of the formation: of the redemptive history, of textual criticism, of Israelite history, and an evaluation of critical scholarship. The Christ-centered interpretation of the Old Testament will be presupposed: taking into consideration the organic, progressive structure of biblical theology. Attention will be given to both the texts and contexts of the theological enterprise through a variety of interpretive methodologies. Special emphases will be placed on the nature of covenantal theology and the role of law and gospel in contemporary thought.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this course the student will:

- 1. Understand the history and salient issues of biblical theology and OT theology
- 2. Be familiar with the major overarching themes of the Old Testament
- 3. Be able to identify key passages for doing Old Testament theology
- 4. Understand and articulate basic problems and some proposed solutions for the relationship of the Old and New Testaments and how we approach the Old Testament as Christians
- 5. Begin to integrate Old Testament theology into a personal systematic theology
